I. BEST PRACTICES FOR COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

■ **Proviso Language:** "Best practices for increasing meaningful and inclusive community engagement that takes into account barriers to participation that may arise due to race, color, ethnicity, religion, income, or education level."

PRELIMINARY RECOMMENDATION FOR BEST PRACTICES FOR COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

All Washington state agencies should create an agency-specific Community Engagement Plan that contains all relevant resources and information included in the Subcommittee's guidance document.

QUESTIONS WE'LL ANSWER

- Why didn't you provide a set of best practices?
- Where is the alignment with the mapping subcommittee?
- How can an agency with little to no experience with EJ principles implement this?

JUSTIFICATION FOR THIS APPROACH & RECOMMENDATION

Abundance of best practice guides for community engagement exists, but are NOT often easily implemented

How is the subcommittee addressing this problem?

- Guidance will be tailored to agency implementers, with several WA-specific examples and elements
 designed to overcome barriers to meaningful engagement across shared agency activities
- Copy & Paste: Take language from this document for your community engagement plan tailored to needs and essential functions of your agency

FEEDBACK REQUESTED

- How do these things land for you?
 - Our recommendation: Each agency develops a community engagement plan
 - Our presumed audience: Agency staff (implementers), not necessarily executive leadership.
 Any thoughts on benefits/limits of this model in terms of its utility for that audience?
 - Our approach: What about this approach gives you heartburn? Are there missing elements?

GUIDANCE DOCUMENT TOUR

- Current Rough Draft / Outline: Sections are written in different styles
- Three main sections:
 - Introduction: Why community engagement is crucial & guidance document's purpose
 - Recommended elements of an agency community engagement plan
 - Examples & resources
- Aligned with Mapping Subcommittee's approach
 - Will provide guidance on best practices for community engagement across major agency activities (e.g. permitting, grantmaking, etc.)

II. MEASUREABLE GOALS

■ **Proviso Language:** "Measurable goals for reducing environmental health disparities for each community in Washington state and ways in which state agencies may focus their work towards meeting those goals."

II. MEASUREABLE GOALS

- With no authority or auditing mechanism, we assume agencies must measure and evaluate their own work.
- Our resources section will include an expanded, organized collection of evaluation tools agencies
 can use, following those presented in January's Task Force meeting.
- Requesting feedback
 - This is a challenging section of the proviso to interpret what are your thoughts?

III. MODEL POLICIES

■ **Proviso Language:** "Model policies that prioritize highly impacted communities and vulnerable populations for the purpose of reducing environmental health disparities and advancing a healthy environment for all residents."
