TASK FORCE CREATION

Created through a proviso in the state's 2019-2021 operating budget

- ➤ State general funds:
 - >\$300,000 (FY20)
 - >\$90,000 (FY21)



- Created through legislation in 2006 (2SSB 6197).
- 17 members:
 - 14 from state agencies, boards, and commissions
 - 3 selected by the Governor
- Identify priorities and create recommendations for the Governor and Legislature.
- Eliminate health disparities by race/ethnicity and gender.

To improve health outcomes, especially within communities that are most severely and frequently impacted by environmental health hazards in the state.




PATHWAY TO ACHIEVING THIS GOAL

PURPOSE

To recommend strategies for incorporating environmental justice principles into future State agency actions across Washington





RESPONSIBILITIES

This Task Force will produce a final report due to the legislature and Governor by October 31, 2020

The final report must include:

- Guidance for State agencies about how to use the Washington Environmental Health Disparity Map to identify highly impacted communities
- Best practices for increasing meaningful and inclusive community engagement
- Recommendations for establishing measurable goals for reducing environmental health disparities and ways in which state agencies may focus their work towards meeting those goals
- 4. **Model policies** that prioritize highly impacted communities and vulnerable populations

Community Engagement


(Required report study area #2)
