The Environmental Justice Task Force is supported by two subcommittees, one focused on the Environmental Health Disparities Map and the other concentrating on community engagement among historically marginalized populations and highly impacted communities. Both subcommittees will recommend model policies and measureable goals for reducing environmental health disparities. Subcommittees will meet monthly to collaborate on current efforts, present findings, and share resources.

These objectives are specifically for the Environmental Health Disparities Map subcommittee and are from guidance outlined in the budget proviso for the Environmental Justice Task Force. The proposed order and timeline (organized by required outcome) for the objectives are listed above. Many objectives will need to be completed simultaneously across and within study areas.
