

### HIR OVERVIEW

HIRs can be requested for any bill topic.

An HIR is an objective, non-partisan, evidence-based analysis to determine how a legislative or budgetary change will likely impact health and equity in Washington State.

HIRs can be requested by any legislator or the governor.

(RCW 43.20.285)






#### QUALITATIVE AND QUANTITATIVE EVIDENCE

#### Reviews of Literature


Analysts conduct specific reviews of literature to determine how the provisions of the proposal may impact health and which populations are most likely to be impacted by the proposed change

#### **Key Informant Engagement**







