 The bill was later converted into a budget proviso that was reflected in Chapter 334, Laws of 2021, Sec 113, the budget proviso funding this project.


- How and when is a request for an LEA initiated?

Coordination

This means that upon receiving the LEA request, an OFM analyst reads the associated bill to determine which agencies should prepare the LEA report.

Lead Agency OFM designates a lead agency and sends the request to the assigned agencies via Fiscal Note System software or a similar. If there are two or more agencies involved, the lead agency is responsible for coordinating shared assumptions among the agencies. And analyst trained by the Office of Equity or Department of Enterprise Services reviews the completed LEA.

Review

After the agencies approve the equity report internally, they release and transmit the note to OFM for review. The review will note the use of the approved format, accuracy, reasonableness, and completeness.
