

# **E2SHB Section 14**

Section 14. Jointly Developed Recommendations for Institutional Education Reforms and the Establishment of an Advisory Group

OSPI and the DCYF must jointly develop recommendations for the establishment, implementation, and funding of a reformed institutional education system that successfully meets the education and support needs of persons in and released from secure settings. The recommendations must address the establishment of:

- An **organizational and accountability structure** that is focused on meeting complex student needs and improving student outcomes
- An equitable, long-term **funding model** that sustainably supports the organizational and accountability structure
- A regular and ongoing review of **system performance and education outcomes**





# **E2SHB Section 14**

# Section 14. Jointly Developed Recommendations for Institutional Education Reforms and the Establishment of an Advisory Group

Other required recommendations relate to information systems, available tiered supports, efficiency and improvement, staffing, curriculum, education advocates, data tracking, safety, family engagement, transition services, enrichment and engagement opportunities, post-secondary options, and pathways.

- Must be developed in consultation with a newly established institutional education structure and accountability advisory group (Advisory Group).
- Must designate an external entity to facilitate the process of developing the recommendations and the involvement of the Advisory Group.
- Interim report on progress to the Governor and the Education and Fiscal Committees of the House of Representatives and the Senate was submitted on **December 15, 2021**.
- A full report, including recommendations, must be submitted to the Governor and the Education and Fiscal Committees of the House of Representatives and the Senate, by **November 1, 2022**.

AIR is a nonpartisan, non-profit organization whose mission is to generate and use rigorous evidence to contribute to a better and more equitable world.
