Navigating Immigration & Health

These Know Your Rights with ICE flyers from WAISN are also available in Spanish, Portuguese, French, Somali and Lingala to ensure everyone knows their rights in an encounter with the Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) or Customs and Border Protection (CBP).

RSVP to Legal Workshops with Washington West African Center (WAWAC). Join WAWAC and US Immigration Attorney Kelsey Beckner to learn about your rights, responsibilities and adjusting your status or file your citizenship. **Meetings are inperson or virtual, ranging from early-Feb to Oct.** Food and language interpretation will be available.

Washington State Superintendent of Public Instruction released guidance on state and federal protections for immigrant students in Washington's K–12 public schools.

WA HealthPlanFinder.com has information on the **health care options available for immigrants** such as Apple Health, Apple Health for Kids, and Cascade Care Plans. More details on options can be found **here**.

The Washington Health Care Authority **Citizenship and Immigration Status Guide** for guidance shows what health care insurance you may be eligible for.

Your child may be eligible for Apple Health for Kids free or low-cost coverage (with a low premium). Visit the Help Me Grow Benefit Finder to determine eligibility or call 1-800-322-2588.

Most Apple Health (Medicaid) coverage will not count against you in the public charge test. Learn more here.

Learn more about potential changes in federal immigration policies and practices from The Washington Office of Refugee and Immigrant Assistance (ORIA).

Being on WIC does not make you a public charge and does not affect your immigration status. U.S. citizenship is not required to qualify for WIC. **Check your eligibility here.**

Governor-elect Bob Ferguson has **outlined his budget priorities for the upcoming term**, which include a focus on reducing state spending by \$4 billion.

DOH and Tulalip Tribe sign historic Tribal-specific data sharing agreement. The Washington State Department of Health (DOH) and Tulalip Tribe made history by signing the first data sharing agreement of its kind in our state.

A Program to Close Insurance Gaps for Native Americans Has Largely Gone Unused. In Washington state, where sponsorship in ACA plans began in 2014, 12 of 29 tribes participate.

New Apple Health birth doula benefit. The Washington State Health Care Authority (HCA) launched a **new birth doula benefit for Apple Health (Medicaid)** on January 1, 2025.
